Forgetting and Remembering in 2021

As we enter a new year and reflect on the old, I believe there are things to remember and things that should be forgotten.

We are used to forgetting things. But the **things we should forget** aren't always as easy to forget.

- a. Our forgiven sins.
 - a. God forgives and treats us better than we deserve. 1 John 1:9; Psalm 103:8-12
- b. Our past successes (Philippians 3:7, 14)
- c. I'm tempted to go on with others (the hurts we have received) that should not be worn on our shirt sleeves, but Christianity is far more than, "Forget it!"

Things to Remember

- a. Remember that we live one day at a time. Matt 6:34
- b. Remember that God has placed us in a physical body in a physical world.
 - i. Richard Foster: "The discovery of God lies in the daily and the ordinary, not in the spectacular and the heroic. If we cannot find God in the routines of home and shop, then we will not find him at all."
 - ii. The temptation is ever present to try to be a purely spiritual being. God has placed us in a physical body. Jesus had a lot to say about our spirituality being about how we treat others in our communities.
- c. God Loves me and wants me to love you. "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. John 13:34. The context of this teaching is the washing the disciples' feet.
