Wrong Road

Up at Sioux Lookout, there is a sign pointing down a road and it simply says "Wrong Road." I don't know if it was a joke or if it was the real name of the road.

As we go through life we often get on "wrong roads." In almost every case we think it is the right road until we have driven on it for some time and something tells us we are on the "wrong road."

The wrong road always looks like the right road till something happens. Last year a truck driver in London, Ontario was driving on a street and all of a sudden found the front end of his truck six feet below street level and the back end sticking up in the air. London's underground piping is old. It breaks and water erodes the ground over time. Then when there is no earth to support the asphalt it suddenly caves into a big sink hole. There was still enough support that the asphalt would carry cars but when his loaded truck crossed it the street collapsed, and the truck went down front first.

The man was interviewed and he told the TV crew that everything looked fine. There were cars using the street. He never thought of it collapsing under him.

This reminds me of a passage of scripture. Prov. 14:12

"There is a way that seems right to a man. But its end is the way of death. NKJV The same words are repeated in Prov. 16:25. The truck driver didn't die. He wasn't even hospitalized. But he sure didn't get where he intended to go that day.

In both our physical lives and spiritual lives there are wrong roads that look like they are right roads. There are paths that we take that appear would take us where we want to go that fail us. That is why prayer is so important. We need to ask God and as many spiritual people as we can, to guide us. In the process of prayer we become more aware of the presence of God in our lives simply because we are praying to God. That in itself is sometimes all we need to prompt us to question again the life road we are taking. Sometimes God's children have already taken the road and can give us good advice. ~ Les Cramp
